Association for College Admission Counseling, the College Board, and ACT. **Granville High School is a 2021 National Blue Ribbon School award recipient.** After release of the 2017-2018 State Report Card, Granville Exempted Village School District was ranked 13th out of more than 600 districts in Ohio. In 2015, Granville High School was recognized with the "All A Award" by the Ohio State Board of Education for outstanding performance on the Ohio State Report Card.

Requirements: Twenty-one credits are required for the Class of 2022 including English (4 units); Mathematics (4 units, including Algebra II); Social Studies (3 units); Science (3 units, including one Life Science and one Physical Science); Technology, Fine Arts, or Global Language (1 unit); Fine Arts (1 unit). Additionally, a 1/2 unit in

Physical Education (may be waived), a 1/2 unit in Health, a course in Financial Literacy, and seven additional units are required. The Class of 2022 must also earn one of the following: 18 points on seven end-of-course state tests, an industry credential, a passing score on a work-readiness assessment, or a remediation free score on the ACT or SAT. Granville High School provides students the opportunity to explore world issues and appreciate different perspectives on those topics. GHS was the first in the state to launch—and is one of only two Ohio high schools to offer—the prestigious Global Scholars Diploma program, in partnership with the Columbus Council on World Affairs. The first cohort eligible to receive the Global Scholars Diploma was the Class of 2014.

The program allows committed students in grades 9-12 the opportunity to participate in unique experiences both in and out of the classroom. A hallmark of the diploma is the Global Issues course, whose curriculum changes annually based on the topics in the book, Great Decisions Briefing. Beyond Global Issues, students follow a specific curriculum and convey their learning via the creation of a portfolio and capstone presentation to earn their certificate indicating "global competence". Students are also afforded opportunities to travel and experience global perspectives first-hand. Since 2014, students have traveled to China, Costa Rica, Peru, and Cuba. Educational Land Lab



In 2014, Granville School District became home to an educational land lab. A small group of AP Environmental Science students developed the idea for the outdoor classroom and secured a partnership with Denison University, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Licking County Soil and Water Conservation District.

College Credit Plus

Students may participate in College Credit Plus, which includes taking courses for college credit at The Ohio State University (Newark campus), Central Ohio Technical College (COTC), or any other participating Ohio public or private institution. Students may also opt to take classes at Denison University through The Licking County Scholars Program. College credit courses taken in disciplines wherein GHS has AP offerings will receive the benefit of a weighted grade.

Ohio Honors Diploma

GHS seniors who complete coursework above the minimum required to graduate, while also earning a GPA of 3.5 or higher and meeting a set SAT or ACT benchmark are eligible to receive the Honors Diploma upon graduation. In 2021, 43% of graduating seniors earned the Honors Diploma.
