# Academic Honors Diploma for Class of 2025

<b>Subject</b>	<b>High School Academic Diploma with Honors</b>
<b>English</b>	4 units
<b>Mathematics</b>	4 units, including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II or equivalent and another higher level course or a four-year sequence of courses that contain equivalent content
<b>Science</b>	4 units
<b>Social Studies</b>	4 units
<b>Foreign Language</b>	3 units, including at least 2 units in each language studied
<b>Fine Arts</b>	1 unit
<b>Grade Point Average</b>	3.5 on a 4.0 scale
<b>ACT/SAT Score [excluding scores from the writing sections]</b>	27 ACT / 1280 SAT

**Must meet all but 1 of the criteria**

# GLOBAL SCHOLARS DIPLOMA

- To earn the Global Scholars Diploma, beyond the badge requirements you have already earned, you will...
  - Need to continue to take either the 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> year of the same language
  - Complete other badge requirements
  - Complete coursework required by the program outside of your regular schedule
- You need to take “Global Issues” in 12<sup>th</sup> grade if you did not take it this year.
- You need to take AP Environmental Science or Environmental Studies if you did not take it this year.

# NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

In September, for those students not already in NHS, seniors with a 3.5 GPA or higher are invited to apply for NHS. There is a 40-hour community service requirement, in addition to leadership and character components.

# ACADEMIC LETTER

- Students can become eligible for an Academic Letter after completion of four full semesters of high school with at least two being completed at GHS.
- Students may apply for the Academic Letter two times a year (Sept. 1st - 15th & Jan. 10th-25th). Invitation to apply sent through Schoology by Mr. Hinton.
- In order to be eligible, students must satisfy four of the five criteria below:
  - GPA - 3.5 or above.
  - ACT or SAT score a. ACT - 27 or higher (minimum of 22) b. SAT - 1290 (minimum of 1120)
  - 3. Attendance - 95% or higher
  - 4. Community Service a. Complete 20 hours of community service
  - 5. School Involvement - Student must meet either the Fine Arts Seal or Engagement Seal



# TYPICAL SENIOR SCHEDULE

- Study Hall (can be early release, late arrival, or senior lunch)

40 hours per quarter/80 hours per sem = .5 credit

Cost: \$ 250

**Independent Study** (in conjunction with a teacher)—Must be Pre-Approved

Paperwork must be submitted before the end of the school year. Paperwork is available in the counseling office.

# MENTORING AND SCHOOL LEADERSHIP

- Freshman participate in this program as mentees
- 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students mentor small groups of freshman
  - Must have a full-year study hall to participate
  - Consists of peer tutoring, transition to high school, study skills training, etc.
  - Worth 0.5 credits for a full year
- Applications available today!
  - Discipline, maturity, essay, GPA
  - Deadline April 5th!



# BENEFITS OF AP

## AP = Advanced Placement

- College-level courses taught at the high school.
- In May, students will take the AP tests for potential college credits.
- Scores range from 1 (lowest) to 5 (highest). Check with your college/university to learn the score you must earn to receive credit.
- Scores of 3 or better earn credit at all Ohio public colleges.
- Weighted GPA if earn C or above
- Cost is approximately \$97 per exam.

- May be taken at GHS, the college campus or online
- Would be at no cost to the family
- Complete and submit *Intent to Participate form by April 1<sup>st</sup>*
